

Dole, Sebelius, Shriver listed most conservative by ADA

WASHINGTON — By the standards of the Americans for Democratic Action, a liberal organization, the 1973 voting record of Sen. Robert Dole (R-Kan.) was considerably more conservative than that of his senior colleague, Sen. James Pearson (R-Kan.).

And, according to the liberal political action group, Rep. Garner Shriver (R-4th) and Rep. Keith Sebelius (R-1st) are the most conservative of the state's 5 House members.

Dole scored 10 points out of a possible 100 in the ADA's annual ratings. Pearson scored 45. Shriver and Sebelius both were rated at eight.

The annual ratings by the ADA list senators' and representatives' votes on key issues and compare them with ADA positions.

Pearson's ranking of 45 was close to the overall Senate average of 47, but considerably higher than the average Republican rating of 26. The average Democratic rating was 62.

Ten score zero

Dole was one of 22 senators who scored 10 or less in the ratings. Ten senators scored zero. The highest rated Republican was Sen. Charles McC. Mathias of Maryland, who scored 90.

No senator scored 100. Three of them — Walter Mondale (D-Minn.), Edmund Muskie (D-Main), and Gaylord Nelson (D-Wisc.) — scored 95.

Dole received a "plus" rating from the ADA on only 2 votes: he voted for an amendment to the Senate rules to reduce secrecy in the operation of Senate committees and against an amendment to the Alaska pipeline bill to bar judicial review of the environmental aspects of the pipeline project and direct the Secretary of the Interior to issue permits for the project.

Pearson received "pluses" from the ADA on 8 of the 20 votes.

In the House, Reps. Joe Skubitz (R-5th) and Larry Winn (R-3rd) received slightly higher ratings than their Republican colleagues, both scoring 20.

The only Kansas Democrat in the House, Second District Rep. William Roy, received a rating of 68.

The average House score was 41, with Republicans averaging 17 and Democrats 59. Ten representatives, all Democrats, scored 100 percent, compared to 22 last year. Forty-seven scored zero, including 43 Republicans and 4 Democrats. Ninety received a zero rating last year.

Shriver and Sebelius received pluses for only two votes. Winn and Skubitz got pluses on five.

Sebelius got a plus on a vote against an amendment to the National Energy Emergency Act to ban the allocation of petroleum for busing of students to schools farther than the school nearest their homes, and on a vote for an amendment to the military procurement bill to limit military spending to \$20.45 billion.

Shriver also got a plus on his vote for the military procurement ceiling and for a vote against an amendment which would have watered down a bill granting home rule to the District of Columbia.

Sebelius was the only Kansas congressman voting for the home rule amendment.

The Salina forums will feature issues of specific interest to Salinans and area persons. Topics will be the energy crisis, city government, profit and loss — the American economic system, and media and opinion — reporting news to the public. Dates of the forums will be announced.

Larry Anderson, chairman of the division of continuing education, said in the future Marymount expects to present through continuing education an evening studies program in which college credit will be offered.


Larned hospital investigation planned
